

- Application and fee
- · GMAT or GRE score
- TOEFL score (if applicable)
- Personal statement
- Resumé/CV
- Two letters of recommendation
- Official copies of transcripts from all colleges and universities attended
- Personal interview (in-person or video conference)

Qualifications

- Bachelor's degree or its equivalent from a recognized academic institution of acceptable standing
- Grade point average of B (3.0 on a 4.0 scale) or better
- Quantitative background in subjects such as calculus and intermediate statistics and probability is encouraged
- Undergraduate degree in science, engineering, or mathematics, or in an economics or business program is recommended
