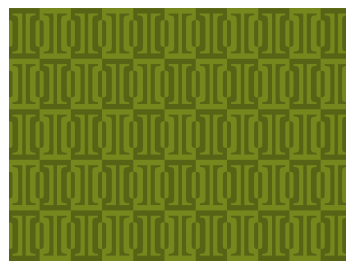
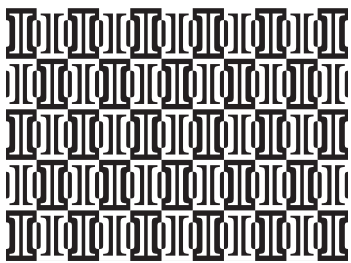

PATTERN AND USE



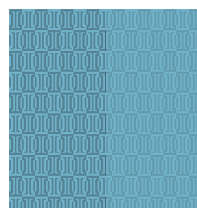
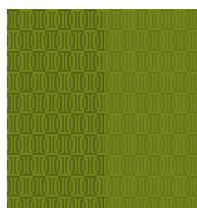
Organizations that don't have a proprietary logo may use the “I” icon pattern. Use the “Multiply” blend mode when placing the pattern over color, and set the opacity to 15% or 30%, depending on the usage. Use your best judgement when placing type over the image, and make sure there's enough contrast between the text and the background.

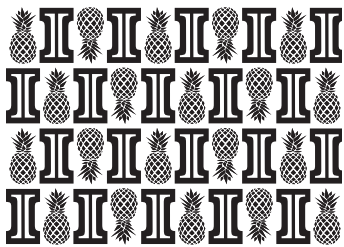

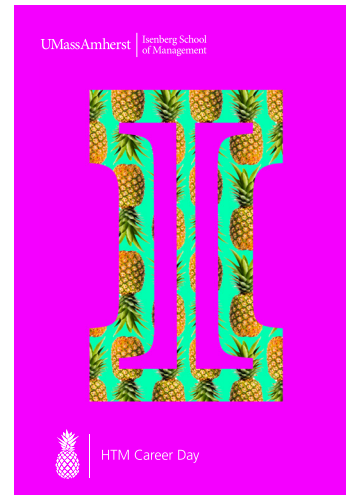
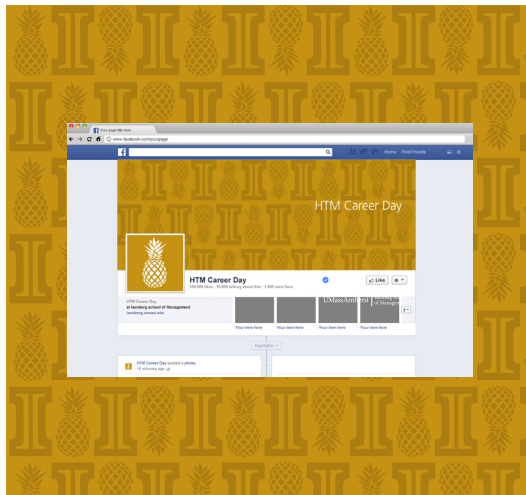

PATTERN AND USE



Organizations that have a proprietary logo may use the logo in the pattern, combined with the Isenberg icon as a background texture. Use the “Multiply” blend mode when placing the pattern over color, and set the opacity to 15% or 30%, depending on the usage. Use your best judgement when placing type over the image, and make sure there’s enough contrast between the text and the background.
