This project-based course integrated students' sport management skills through consulting projects with local sport organizations (e.g., Amherst Youth Soccer Association, Firecracker Sports). Student groups conducted strategic analyses, stakeholder surveys, and delivered tailored recommendations. The course emphasized client engagement, design thinking, and applied qualitative research to address real-world sport business challenges.

# SPORTMGT 494PI - Sport Policy - 2 sections

Fall 2024

Instructor of Record

This course integrates students' acquired skills and experiences in sport management by planning and evaluating all facets of a sport-related business plan. The primary objective is to guide students from idea development to crafting a viable business plan for the sports industry. This course uses various teaching modes (e.g., lecture, workshop, field experiments and qualitative interviewing) to advance students' learning.

#### **SPORTMGT 323 - College Athletics**

Fall 2024

Instructor of Record

This course explores the role of intercollegiate athletics within higher education, examining historical developments, governance and economic structures, and key issues such as amateurism, race and gender. Students analyze organizational structures, finances, and legal challenges facing the NCAA. The course also covers contemporary issues, including Name, Image, Likeness (NIL), conference realignments and mental health, providing a comprehensive view from both management and social justice perspectives.

# Other Teaching through the University of Massachusetts-Amherst

#### Global Institute of Sport Business (GISB): Sport Entrepreneurship & Innovation

July 2025

This two-week intensive master's course (100 hours as asynchronous week 1, synchronous week 2) guided students from idea development to a viable sport business plan. Using lectures, workshops, field experiments, and qualitative interviews—along with gamified elements like a war game—students applied their sport management knowledge to real-world entrepreneurial challenges.

#### SPMT 366 - Sport Facilities & Event Management

This course covered the design, operation, and management of sport facilities and events, emphasizing safety, cost-efficiency, accessibility, and sustainability. Students completed a facility audit with improvement recommendations for campus sport spaces.

This course explores the history and evolution of the Olympic Games. I assessed 45+ students over the summer term and provided guidance on their written communication.
